Hurricane Ida Repairs Update

Hurricane Ida repairs are starting to move along. We just recently opened the bids for the interior work for the church. The bid will be officially awarded soon and contracts will be signed. Once this happens, the contractor will begin working on the interior work of the church. We are hoping that we can work with the contractor to be able to have Mass in the church while work is going on. The interior work could take from three to six months to complete. Please excuse any inconvenience that occurs during this time.

We also met recently with the Diocese on our long-term plan for our entire plant facility. The Diocese has endorsed our current plan and we are currently awaiting approval from FEMA. The plan would include demolishing the Parish Center, KC Home (Convent) and the old gym. The cafeteria would remain and continued to be used. Once we get approval from FEMA to demolish those buildings, we would then build a new parish center to accommodate classes and parish functions. It will be about the same square footage as our current parish center, but would be designed with a better floor plan and would meet modern codes. Of course, it means that it would be elevated. Our architect, Houston Lirette is currently working on this plan. Both the Diocese and St. Joseph Parish is ready to move on this once our plan is approved by FEMA.

SYNOD OF BISHOPS

The Synod of Bishops will take place this October in Rome. The Diocese have asked for parish input to the two following questions:

- 1. Where have I seen or experienced successes and distresses within the Church's structure, organization, leadership, and life that wither encourage or hinder her mission?
- 2. How can the structures and organization of the Church help all the baptized to respond to the call to proclaim the Gospel and to live as a community of love and mercy in Christ?

The focus of these questions seems to be on the structure of the Church. 1) how has her structure both helped and hindered the mission of evangelization and discipleship, and 2) how can that structure and organization be improved to better facilitate that mission?
