


Easter Altar **Sacrament of Baptism**

This is an occasion for us to thank God for our catholic faith and to hold it dear to our heart and appreciate it by our active participation in the church. I thank you all for your active participation at the Holy week events.

Divine Mercy Sunday is a day of special grace offered to us during the Eucharistic adoration that we will have this Sunday, April 7th, from 2-3 p.m. There will be confessions available at this time, which also offers a special grace of Mercy. I request you all to come and participate at this divine Mercy Sunday adoration.

I would like to congratulate all our first communicants as they receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time in their life. I thank the teachers, parents and all those who helped them out for this special occasion of their life.

Next Sunday is our boat blessing. I pray that that all our fishermen receive blessings from the Lord in this year of their fishing and shrimping. May God protect them and all to have a safe sailing and a bountiful catch. I thank Tracie Defelice and all those who organize this event.

In the month of April, the diocese is organizing a training program for the Eucharistic ministers. I request more volunteers to come forward for this ministry and to attend one of the training programs that is held at Pastoral Center. Also, those who are already a minister can attend one to refresh their knowledge about this ministry.



Eucharist and its Meaning

The Holy Communion, known also as the Lord's Supper, represents the greatest expression of God's love for His people. Two items are used in the Holy Communion—the bread which represents Jesus' body that was scourged and broken before and during His crucifixion, and the cup which represents His shed blood. When Jesus walked on earth, He was vibrant, and His body was full of life and health. He was never sick. But before Jesus went to the cross, He was badly scourged by the Roman soldiers, and His body was torn as He hung on the cross.

The Holy Communion is God's ordained channel of healing and wholeness. On the night that He was betrayed, Jesus ate His last supper with His disciples. And knowing what He would accomplish through His sacrifice, He instituted the Holy Communion (Luke 22:19–20, 1 Corinthians 11:24–25). His loving instruction is that we are to remember Him as we partake of the Holy Communion. Jesus wanted us conscious of how His body was broken for our wholeness, and His blood was shed for the forgiveness of our sins. And whenever we partake in this consciousness, we "proclaim the Lord's death till He comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26).

Whenever we receive the body and blood of Christ, we become one with him. And he longs to be with us, and that is why he told us at the last supper "do this in memory of me". We should be more than happy to participate at the Mass in memory of him and to receive His Body and Blood.

Divine Mercy Sunday

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. **The Image:** Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary,no.742).

And what is Divine Mercy? The word "Divine" means "given by God" or "like God". The word "Mercy" means "the refraining from harming or punishing offenders". So simply put, Divine Mercy is "God refraining from harming or punishing offenders".

Jesus said to Sr.Faustina: My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. (Diary, no. 699)
